

Go Karts

All groups will visit the Go Kart track once or twice weekly. Campers will attend Session A, June 29 to July 24 or Session B, July 27 to August 14, or Sessions A & B.

Class Management:

- When a group goes to go karts they will be accompanied by two to four group counselors.
- Counselors and campers should be directed to sit at the 4 red benches.
- The group counselor will help the go kart specialist divide the group.
- The specialist will quickly teach the group the basics of driving and riding
 - ✓ Gas and break location
 - ✓ Feet off the gas when taking turns
 - ✓ Hug the corners when taking turns
 - ✓ Keep distance between your kart and the kart in front of you.
 - ✓ Do not touch key or buttons on the kart "dash"
 - ✓ If you crash, foot off the gas
- Campers not driving or riding will be instructed to either watch the track or play gaga ball or games by the picnic table with **the senior group counselor.**
- Assistant group counselors will be assigned stations around the track or help campers switch out of karts at the pit.

Who can drive and who will ride

- Pre-K campers and Kindergarten campers may not drive. They will ride alongside a counselor.
- When campers are in first grade and up they may drive.
- All campers must be given the opportunity to ride or drive

Track Rules

- Assign campers to karts
- Counselors can only drive if they are with a camper in Pre-k or Kindergarten
- Campers must keep hands and feet in kart at all times.
- Camper's and counselors must wear
 - Helmets
 - Seatbelts
- Once in the karts, the track entrance must be closed
- When Karts are running no one is allowed on track
- If a camper crashes and needs assistance, assistant counselors stationed around the track will stop all karts "feet off gas"
- Once track is clear campers may continue to drive.
- **When switching drivers, all karts must be stopped with engines off before campers exit their karts**

Switching at the pit

- After campers have driven two or three laps **all karts must stop at the pit.**
- As karts enter the pits, **engines must be turned off and no one may exit their kart.**
- Once the last kart is in the pit and all engines are turned off, signal campers to exit karts
- Once all campers have switched, make sure everyone is buckled and turn engines back on.
- Have the karts exit the pit one at a time.
- You must space karts.
- You must be in control

Special Cleaning and Sanitizing instructions for Go Karts and equipment.

At the beginning of each day you will pick up your pump sprayer/sprayers. They will be prefilled with the solution you will use to sanitize after each period.

Sanitizing instructions

When a group comes to Go Karts confirm with the senior group counselor that campers and counselors have just washed their hands. Clean and sanitized equipment should be ready for the group. At the end of the period when you dismiss the group you must spray down all Go Karts, helmets, benches, table games and gaga ball. The solution sprayed must sit for 10 min before the next group uses it. Be mindful of spraying solution when it is windy out or around campers and counselors.

Groups will be small this year. You can rotate go karts and equipment.

Other tasks

You must arrive by 8:30 each day. You will have your temperature taken once you arrive and must wash your hands. You will be given a morning and afternoon assignment.

Morning and afternoon Kart and Track Maintenance

- Each morning specialist must check every Kart. "Bolts, chains, oil"
- Track may need to be raked off or blown off. Maintenance crew will help
- Karts must be gassed up for the day
- If anything is broken speak to one of the directors.
- If something breaks during a period you must not fix it. Pull the kart off the track and wait for the period to end.
- Never fill gas when campers are in kart or engine is running and hot
- 2 fire extinguishers will be positioned around the track hanging on trees.
